A New Era Begins for MMF

If you have followed Mayview Mo Foundation from the beginning in 2015, you know we started with a property that had been neglected for over 20 years. A leaking roof, broken windows, invasion by a raccoon village, overgrown trees and weeds and just the ravages of time had resulted in a sad looking eye-sore in the community. Llovd Clouse saw it differently. He somehow convinced other MHS Alumni that there was opportunity in the forlorn property. No one believed that an RV Park could be a success in Mayview, except Kenny There were many skeptics that the Rinne. building was worth saving, especially after leadbased paint and asbestos was found. How could we ever raise \$75,000 for a new roof? There were times we wondered if we would be able to pay the utility bills for another month. But angels kept showing up just when we needed them. Now, after seven years, renovation is complete and the Foundation is self-sufficient with income from the RV Park and rental of space to small businesses. The success of this property renovation and general clean-up of other properties, sparked a renewal of spirit in the community. The increased business with Michelle's Place café and Rocha's Mayview Bar has added employment opportunities and entertainment and dining options. From the beginning, the mission of Mayview Mo Foundation has been "To Revitalize Mayview by Encouraging a Clean, Safe Environment for Citizen and Business Growth". The provides renovated space community organizations, i.e., the 4-H Club, Fire District and Fuller Foundation, (Habitat for Humanity off-shoot), to use the facility for free.

Charitable Giving Fund Established

Thanks to a generous donor, MMF received \$8,000 to establish the **Charitable Giving Fund** and to expand our efforts in helping all citizens of Mayview to thrive. Our first steps were to help the Mayview Lil' Food Pantry by renovating space inside the south entrance to the school. MMF then donated shelving and a refrigerator for the Pantry. Also, a donation of \$500 from MMF was given to **40-Ville 4-H** for the **Feed Missouri** program. We are continuing to investigate other ways we can serve the Mayview community. With help from our friends and donors we will continue to make a difference in our community.
